# From the Leadership Team

### **Dear Ross Park Families**

Welcome back to school for Term 4. We are certainly in the home straight now, with everyone working hard to achieve all that they can before the end of the year. We thank you for your continued support in making sure students are school ready every day, so they can make the most of every opportunity.

I'd like to take this opportunity to thank the Ross Park community for making me feel so welcome since arriving at Ross Park. I am excited to let all families know that I have accepted the principal position at Ross Park for the next four years. I look forward to the opportunity of working with everyone in our school community, as we strive for excellence for all Ross Park learners. Communication, collaboration, and respect for everyone's perspective, will remain key focus areas as we continue our school improvement journey together.

In line with feedback from the parent survey, this week we offered two feedback opportunities for families to contribute to the decision-making around the direction of the school. Unfortunately, only a few parents were able to attend the separate sessions. There will be one more session offered on the 9 November at 3.30pm, and a parent morning tea held after assembly in Week 6. It would be awesome to hear from as many parents as possible, as we finalise our decision-making for 2023. Again, in line with the parent survey data, Afterschool care is on its way! We are working hard to get all final approvals from governing boards for OSHC. It is taking a little longer than we had hoped, and it may mean that we can only do the set up and information sessions in 2022 and be ready to hit the ground running in 2023. We are looking at holding information sessions for all interested families in Week 5. More information to follow.

We are into our final 2 weeks of PAT testing for all students across Ross Park. This data gives teachers effective information about where students are in their reading and maths progress, and what their next steps will involve. It is great to have all students present every day, as this means they can complete the testing process with their class rather than in make-up sessions, later. Thank you for your support in this area.

Over the next 2 weeks we have two amazing performances happening. The Alice Can Dance performances will be held on Thursday 27th October at Araluen Arts Centre. The following Thursday (3rd November), Araluen will host the Alice Beat performance! Ross Park students will shine brightly on stage for both events, and it is great to see so many families supporting these amazing community events. We look forward to seeing everyone there!



Verge parking is a safety hazard to our student pedestrians since it blocks their visibility and prevents them from readily accessing and crossing the road.

# Student Free Day Friday 28 October – 2022




Ross Park will hold a Student Free Day on <u>Friday 28 October</u>. Students are not required to attend school on this day.
